Dear Friends and Supporters of Junior Achievement of Washington,

With deep gratitude, we are excited to share the 2023-2024 Impact Report with our community. Last fiscal year has been a journey of innovation and growth that allowed us to expand our reach, bring our transformative programs to more students, and ignite the joy of learning. We are proud to report that JAWA delivered over 398,000 hours of engaging instruction to over 47,000 students - exceeding our reach goal by over 17%. This achievement would not have been possible without the dedication of over 2,600 volunteers who brought our programs to life in classrooms, virtual spaces, and experiential learning environments.

One of the innovations that contributed to this successful reach was the launch of JA Mobile Finance Park, a mobile learning experience designed to bring immersive education to students anywhere in Washington State. Our newly designed, portable version of JA Finance Park was loaded onto a truck that traveled far and wide across the state, reaching students in Davenport, Kennewick, Spokane, Wenatchee, and Yakima. Over the last school year, more than 1,000 students experienced hands-on learning right in their own neighborhoods.

By breaking down geographical barriers, JA Mobile Finance Park reflects our commitment to culturally responsive and inclusive education. Its adaptable curriculum meets the needs of students with developmental differences, recent arrivals to the U.S., and monolingual Spanish speakers, ensuring that every student receives a valuable and relevant learning experience.

We also introduced new programs that open up endless possibilities for students beyond high school, offering guidance on credential pathways, college preparation, and career readiness. Partnerships with the Washington State Department of Children, Youth, and Families, as well as YouthCare, are extending our reach to support young people in the juvenile justice system and those experiencing homelessness, providing them with critical skills for brighter futures.

These accomplishments are possible only through the dedication of our volunteers, board members, educators, staff, and, of course, supporters like you. Thank you for investing in the boundless potential of young people and for joining us in igniting a passion for learning that lasts a lifetime.

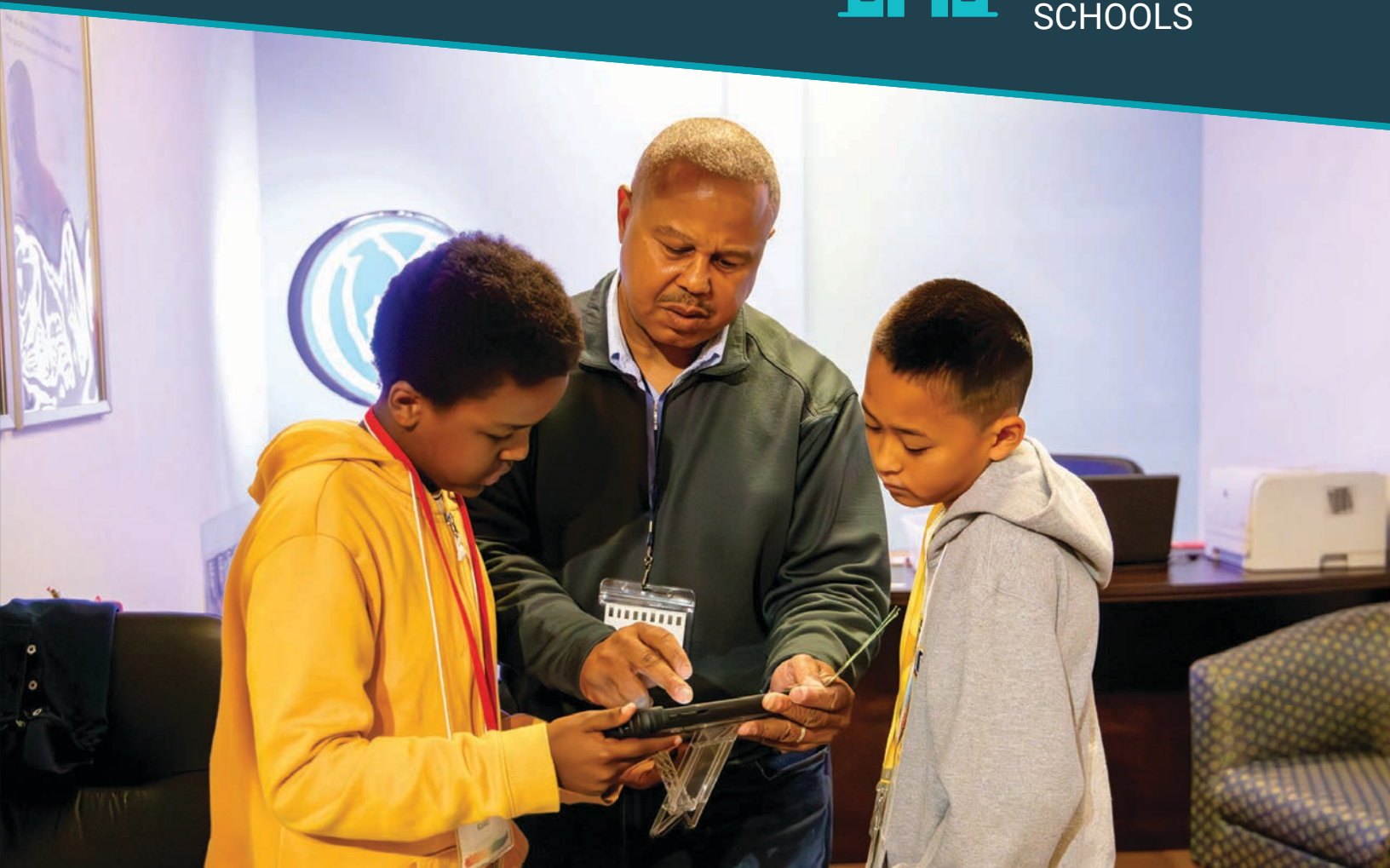

JA EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING PROGRAMS | JA MOBILE FINANCE PARK

Last fall, JAWA launched the **JA Mobile Finance Park** experience, bringing the immersive learning program to more than 1,100 students in rural and urban communities in Central and Eastern Washington. Over 20,000 hours of education were delivered to middle and high school students in Cowiche, Davenport, Kennewick, Spokane, Yakima, Wenatchee, and Zillah.

JA Mobile Finance Park is a game-changing and culturally responsive solution to removing barriers and delivering equitable access to students in the most vulnerable and underserved communities. This inclusive and dynamic learning experience adapts to meet the unique and diverse needs of students, including those with developmental differences, new arrivals to the U.S., and monolingual Spanish speakers.

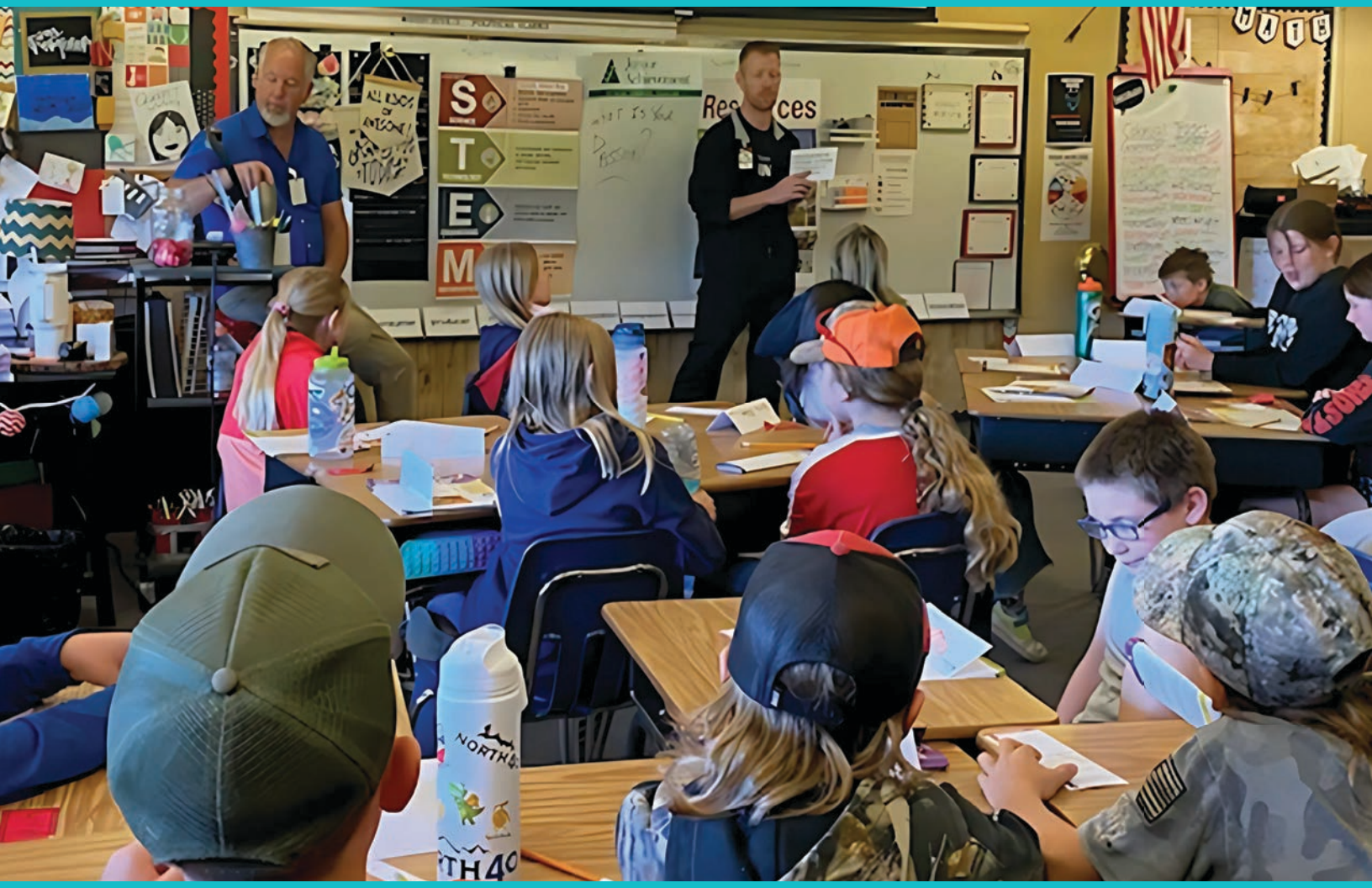
JA PROGRAMS | IN-CLASSROOM EXPERIENCE

During the 2023-2024 school year, JAWA energized over 340 classrooms across Washington State and Northern Idaho with hands-on learning. Partnering with classroom teachers, JA volunteer facilitators brought financial literacy to life, sparking curiosity and engaging students with fun, interactive activities.

JA programs offer K-12 students engaging, age-appropriate lessons with real-life scenarios. From solving the challenge of filling pizza orders to reimagining products with an engineering mindset, and even hearing firsthand career stories from inspiring volunteers, students explore skills that set them up for success.

JA PROGRAMS | REAL-WORLD EXPERIENCE

JA Job Shadow

JA Job Shadow opens up a world of possibilities for students, giving them a chance to dive into their talents, interests, and values while getting a first-hand look at exciting careers. Through real workplace visits, students experience what it's like to work alongside professionals and learn directly from them. For example, students from Raisbeck Aviation High School took part in an inspiring JA Job Shadow day with Delta Air Lines. They got an insider's view of what it takes to run an airline, exploring a variety of careers across the aviation industry—from engineering to customer service to flight operations.



JA Stock Market Challenge

Last year, JAWA launched an exciting Stock Market Challenge competition event, where high school teams faced off during a 60-day stock market challenge. Students started in their classrooms with JA Take Stock in Your Future, a classroom program that equips them with a solid understanding of the highs, lows, and long-term investment strategies.

After classroom competitions, top teams come together at the JA Stock Market Challenge, where students feel the fast-paced excitement of a real trading floor. With plans to expand this into a statewide event, more students will soon experience the thrill of investing and the competition challenge.



JA PROGRAMS | BEYOND HIGH SCHOOL

Serving Young Adults through Innovative Partnerships

JAWA is on a mission to create innovative partnerships that reach students in every corner of the community and beyond the classroom. We are excited to announce a new collaboration with the WA State Department of Children, Youth, and Families, designed to support students who have been involved in the juvenile justice system. Through this partnership, students are gaining essential budgeting and work readiness skills as they prepare to transition back to their home communities. JAWA is eager to learn from this project's pilot phase and expand the programming to more DCYF community facilities across the state.

In previous years, our team developed a dynamic workshop series in partnership with YouthCare to meet the needs of teens and young adults experiencing homelessness. This year, we have adapted those workshops to reach even more young people by partnering with organizations like Futures Northwest, opening doors to new opportunities and empowering young people to build brighter futures.



JA PROGRAMS | PARTNER SPOTLIGHT

Summit Schools

JAWA teamed up with four local Summit Schools to bring hands-on JA learning to life during their exciting two-week expeditions. Over 215 students chose JAWA as their adventure, immersing themselves in real-world experiences in JA BizTown and JA Finance Park.

From launching their own business ideas to tackling the stock market and mastering personal finance, students explored life skills through fun programs like JA Be Entrepreneurial, JA Stock Market Challenge, JA Career Success, and even gained leadership development in JA High School Heroes.
