Successful candidates will have the ability to quickly become expert facilitators for Junior Achievement programs, including the ability to learn and facilitate new programs and facilitate for students entering Kindergarten through 5th grade. This position is part-time, nonexempt, with training and prep during the week of July 7-10, 2026, followed by a set Monday-Friday schedule, July 12-August 2026.
